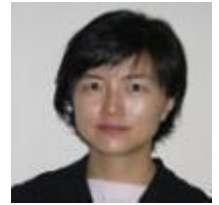

## **Brief Descriptions of the ISRNM Council Members 2018-2020**

### **PRESIDENT:**

**Angela Yee Moon WANG, MD, PhD, FRCP**, is an Associate Consultant and Honorary Associate Professor at the Queen Mary Hospital, University of Hong Kong and was graduated from the University of New South Wales, Australia. She was the recipient of 2018 National Kidney Foundation (NKF) Joel D. Kopple Award. She has also received the John Maher Award of the International Society of Peritoneal Dialysis (ISPD) in 2006, and Travelling Lecturer Award of Asian and Pacific Federation of Clinical Biochemistry in 2012. Angela is currently the President of the ISRNM, Council member of the ISPD and a North and East Asia Regional Board member of the International Society of Nephrology (ISN), Committee Member of the ISN-Advancing Clinical Trial Core Group, and Executive Committee member of the Standardized Outcomes in Nephrology (SONG) Initiative, workgroup member of the SONG-PD and SONG-HD CVD. She was an Executive Committee Member of KDIGO (Jan 2015 - Dec 2017). She is a workgroup member of the NKF KDOQI Nutrition Guidelines in CKD (to be published in 2018/2019) and the ISPD PD Adequacy Guideline update (2017-2019). She was the Chair of the ISPD Adult Cardiovascular and Metabolic Guidelines (2012 – 2015) and is a Subcommittee Chair of the ISPD PDOPPS. She was also a Core workgroup member of the first KDIGO – CKD-MBD guidelines (2007 – 2009). She serves on the editorial board of many journals including JASN, CJASN, NDT (Editor of Cardiovascular Section), Am J Nephrol, Nephron Clin Pract (Associate Editor), Renal Replacement Therapy (Associate Editor), Nephrology (Subject Editor), J Ren Nutr, J Diabetes, etc. She was previously an Associate Editor of AJKD and an International Editor of CJASN. She has given over 100 invited lectures around the world and has published extensively in the areas of CKD and dialysis-related complications, especially in the areas of diet, nutrition and cardiovascular complications.

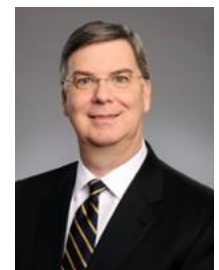
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### **PRESIDENT elect:**

**S. Russ Price, PhD**, is a professor of Medicine and Physiology and Associate Vice Chair for Research, Dept. Medicine, and is also affiliated with the Division of Nephrology at Emory University and Atlanta VA Med. Center. He earned his Ph.D. in Biochemistry and then completed a post-doctoral fellowship in the Laboratory of Cellular Metabolism in the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, MD. Afterwards, Dr. Price joined the Renal Division. He currently holds the rank of Professor of Medicine (with Tenure) and Physiology. In 2012, he was appointed Associate Vice Chair for Research in the Department of Medicine. His research focuses on the mechanisms underlying the protein energy wasting and loss of muscle mass due to chronic kidney disease and diabetes. He is a member of the Editorial Boards of the American Journal of Physiology - Renal Physiology and the Journal of Renal Nutrition; he previously served on the Editorial Boards of The Journal of Biological Chemistry, Kidney International and the Journal of the American Society of Nephrology.

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### **IMMEDIATE past president:**

**Pieter ter Wee, MD, PhD**, is Professor of Nephrology at the VU university medical center (VUmc) Amsterdam. He did his medical school at the Rijks Universiteit Groningen. In 1987 he switched from the Groningen university to the VU university in Amsterdam to finish his training in internal medicine with subsequent training in Nephrology. In 1992 and 1993 he did a postdoc with professor Murray Epstein at the VA hospital in Miami. From 1994 to 2014 he has chaired the department of Nephrology at the VUmc in Amsterdam. From 2007-2013 he was the president of the Dutch Federation of Nephrology and he has participated in several European Best Practice Guidelines. He has (co-)authored over 270 papers. His research topics are related to dialysis (peritoneal and hemodialysis) and nutritional aspects of chronic kidney disease and dialysis.



Currently he is the chief medical officer of VUmc and president-elect of the International Society of Renal Nutrition & Metabolism.

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#### **TREASURER.**

**Alison Steiber**, RDN, PhD (USA) is the Chief Scientific Officer of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics. She is a registered dietitian with a master's degree at The University of Kansas Medical Center and PhD in Nutrition at Michigan State University in East Lansing, MI. Dr. Steiber was responsible for coordinating the Subjective Global Assessment Consensus Conference in 2003, was president of the Cleveland Dietetic Association in 2007-2008, and is currently a member of the National Board for the Commission on Accreditation for Dietetic Education for the American Dietetic Association. In 2008, Dr. Steiber received the Joel Kopple Award from the National Kidney Foundation and was awarded the American Dietetic Association Foundation's first research grant in renal disease. Dr. Steiber has written numerous research publications and has spoken at local, national and international meetings.

**Giacomo Garibotto**, MD, is Professor of Nephrology at the University of Genoa and Head of the Division of Nephrology, Dialysis and Transplantation at the IRCCS AOU San Martino-IST Hospital, Genoa, Italy. He did his medical school at the University of Genoa, Italy. He serves the editorial board of many nephrology journals including J Nephrol, J Ren Nutr, Scientifica, Open Physiology J, Giornale Italiano di Nefrologia, Minerva Urologica e Nefrologica. Awards: International Society of Blood Purification (1997), ISN/Baxter Extramural Program (1996, 2002, 2007). He has co-authored over 170 publications, in the fields of pathophysiology of chronic kidney diseases, renal physiology and biology, biochemistry of renal function, protein metabolism and nutrition in renal disease, diabetic nephropathy.



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#### **COUNCIL MEMBERS:**

**Giuliano Brunori**, MD, Director of the Department of Nephrology and Dialysis, Provincial Trust for Health Care Services, Trento (Italy) since 2008. From 1983 to 2008: assistant professor at Department of Nephrology, Dialysis and Transplantation, University and Spedali Civili in Brescia (Italy). In 1981 he graduated from the University of Milan School of Medicine. After the graduation he attended the Postgraduation School in Nephrology at the University of Turin from 1983 to 1986. From Oct. 1989 to Sept. 1990 he spent 1 year at the Harbor UCLA Medical Centre in Torrance-Los Angeles (California, USA) with prof. Joel D. Kopple for a research program on nutrition in patients with chronic kidney disease. Dr Brunori's primary research interests are nutrition and metabolism in uremic patients (either in predialysis or in dialysis), and the secondary interest is access for dialysis (vascular and peritoneal). As first surgeon he has more than 2500 procedures (fistulas, grafts, central venous catheters, peritoneal catheters). More than 100 peer-review papers on Pubmed, mainly in the field of nutrition, peritoneal dialysis and vascular access. He was the national coordinator of the randomized trial on supplemented very low protein diet vs dialysis in stage 5 chronic kidney disease patients (published in AJKD in 2007). He is the Director of the School on vascular and peritoneal access for dialysis in Trento, attended by Italian nephrologists. Furthermore, he is involved in a non-governmental program on dialysis in Africa, in two states: Mali (city of Bamako) and Ghana (city of Tamale). Since October 2017 he is the president of the Italian Society of Nephrology (2017-2020).

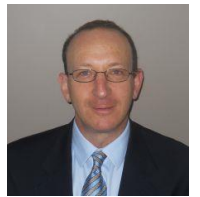

**Jerrilynn D. Burrowes**, PhD, RD, CDN, is Professor and Chair at Long Island Univ., Dept. Nutrition, Brookville, NY. She is a nationally recognized clinical nutrition leader in the field of kidney disease. Dr. Burrowes is the author and co-author of numerous research and review articles published in refereed journals relating to the HEMO Study and other topics. In addition, she is the co-editor of a textbook published by Humana Press in 2008 entitled “Nutrition in Kidney Disease.” Dr. Burrowes has held many leadership and advisory roles in professional organizations and societies, and she has served on numerous association committees. For her outstanding contributions to the field of kidney disease, Dr. Burrowes received the Recognized Renal Dietitian Award and the Joel D. Kopple Award from the NKF/CRN.  
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**Allon Friedman**, attended medical school at McGill University in Montreal, Canada, and completed his internal medicine residency and nephrology fellowships at Tufts University in Boston, USA. He subsequently did an additional fellowship in clinical nutrition at the US Department of Agriculture Human Nutrition Research Center for Aging in Boston. He is currently an Associate Professor of Medicine at Indiana University School of Medicine, Indianapolis, USA, where he cares for patients with kidney disease and performs clinical research using a variety of study designs. He is also medical director of their dialysis unit. His research has focused on a number of topics related to the overlap between kidney disease and nutrition with a specialized interest on the impact of obesity on the kidney. His research projects have been funded by the National Institutes of Health, National Kidney Foundation, and a variety of other private foundations. He has participated in national and international working groups including the KDIGO Working Group on chronic kidney disease and arrhythmias. He received his nephrology training at the Universities of Freiburg and Saarland, Germany, and basic research education at Torrance Memorial Hospital, UCLA, Los Angeles, CA under Joel D. Kopple. From 2003 through 2005 he served as Clinical Research Laboratory Director at the Renal Research Institute in New York, and was Visiting Professor at Albert Einstein College of Medicine, New York, USA. His research interest focuses on management of chronic kidney disease and renal nutrition with a focus on the combination of dietary and medicinal management of hyperphosphatemia; He is also active in the field of treatment and prevention of diabetic nephropathy. Dr. Kuhlmann has published more than 100 original papers in international peer reviewed journals. He is member of several societies, including the German Nephrology Society, the German Diabetes Society, The European Renal Association and the American Society of Nephrology.

**Denis Fouque**, Professor of Nephrology at the University Claude Bernard Lyon1, and Chief of the Division of Nephrology at the Centre Hospitalier Lyon Sud in Lyon, France. He is the past Research Vice President (Health Affairs) at the Université Claude Bernard Lyon, the largest medical school in France (2012-2016). Dr Fouque has published 310 papers, including reviews, meta-analyses and 21 book chapters, among which 2 chapters in *The Kidney*, Brenner and Rector, 2012 and 2015. His current h factor is 58. His research fields are in nutrition and metabolism in chronic kidney disease and dialysis. He is director of the adipocyte dysfunction research group in CARMEN at the University Claude Bernard Lyon1. Dr Fouque also got training in Evidence based Medicine by founding the *Cochrane Collaboration Renal Group* in 1997 and being the Co-ordinating Editor until 2001. Dr Fouque was President of the *International Society for Renal Nutrition and Metabolism* (2004–2006), co-editor-in-Chief of the *Journal of Renal Nutrition* (2003-2011), chairman of the *ERA-EDTA Nutrition Guideline* (2007) and vice-chairman of the *European Renal Best Practice* group of ERA-EDTA until 2017. He is the chairman of the European Nutrition working group of the ERA-EDTA, and the current Editor-in-chief of *Nephrology Dialysis Transplantation* journal. e-mail:

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**Csaba P. Kovesdy, MD**, is The Fred Hatch Professor of Medicine in Nephrology and Director of the Clinical Outcomes and Clinical Trials Program at the University of Tennessee Health Science Center in Memphis, Tennessee and Chief of Nephrology at the Memphis VA Medical Center in Memphis, Tennessee. Dr. Kovesdy earned his medical degree from the University of Pecs Medical School in Pecs, Hungary. He performed his residency in Internal Medicine at the Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit, MI, and completed a clinical fellowship in Nephrology at the Johns Hopkins Bayview Medical Center in Baltimore, MD. Dr. Kovesdy's research interests are centered on epidemiology and outcomes in pre-dialysis chronic kidney disease, including studies in nutritional disorders. He has published his research in over 260 peer-reviewed articles.

**Joel D Kopple**, MD, is Professor of Medicine and Public Health at the Univ. Calif. Los Angeles (UCLA) and Harbor-UCLA Med. Center, Renal Division, in Torrance, California. He served from 1981 to 2007 as the Chief of the Division of Nephrology and Hypertension at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center. He is also known as the father of the field of Renal Nutrition. To recognize the contributions of Joel Kopple to advancing the field of Renal Nutrition, the National Kidney Foundation and its Council on Renal Nutrition designated the 'Joel D Kopple Award in Renal Nutrition, which is annually granted to a distinguished individual for his/her efforts to advance the field of renal nutrition. Kopple has authored or coauthored several hundred peer-reviewed manuscripts. He has founded several organizations including the International Society of Renal Nutrition and Metabolism and the International Federation of National Kidney Foundations. Joel Kopple is an elected Fellow of the American Society for Nutrition. He was the 1993 recipient of the David M. Hume Memorial Award by the National Kidney Foundation. He also received the 2004 Robert H. Herman Memorial Award and the 1997 E.V.
